Success Story of GlobeCoReS 2024

The GlobeSync Community Research and Sustainability Conference (GlobeCoReS 2024), held on 3–4 September 2024 at Curtin University Malaysia and Pullman Miri Waterfront Hotel, brought together a remarkable gathering of researchers, practitioners, and community leaders under the theme "Bridging Gaps, Building Futures: Integrative Strategies for Sustainable Development."

The conference welcomed attendees from 36 countries, with 302 participants joining physically in Miri and more than 600 attending virtually. Over the course of two days, 48 papers were presented, highlighting diverse perspectives and innovative approaches to advancing sustainability across multiple disciplines.

GlobeCoReS 2024 successfully created a vibrant platform where global and local voices met to exchange knowledge, strengthen networks, and chart pathways toward more inclusive and sustainable futures. The strong participation, both in person and online, underscored the shared commitment to addressing pressing global challenges through collaborative research and community-driven solutions.

The impact of GlobeCoReS 2024 extends beyond the event itself—it reinforced our belief that by connecting communities, fostering partnerships, and sharing evidence-based strategies, we can truly build futures that are resilient, inclusive, and sustainable.

Building on this momentum, we now look ahead to GlobeCoReS 2025, to be held on 4–5 December 2025 at Curtin University Malaysia. In addition, we are proud to announce the upcoming 1st Global Conference on Ageing and Longevity (GSAL 2025), which will explore cutting-edge strategies to enhance the health and well-being of ageing populations worldwide.
