Participants will be guided through importing Scopus data, generating network maps, and exploring different layout types to identify research clusters, influential authors, and emerging topics.

It focuses on how to draw meaningful conclusions from the maps and apply insights to literature reviews, publication planning, research networking, and strategic decision-making.
