Pro Vice-Chancellor International Scholarship

Eligibility criteria

- Non-Malaysian citizen
- Full-time enrolled student in ANY degree program at Curtin Malaysia.
- Curtin Malaysia foundation students moving to degree with minimum CWA 80%.
- Curtin Malaysia diploma students moving to degree with minimum CWA 80%.
- Current Curtin Malaysia degree students (second year onwards) with the latest CWA 80%.`
- Not presently holding other scholarships.

Amount of award & duration

The scholarship covers 50% of the tuition fee for the entire duration of the program (3 – 4 years depending on the program of study).

*All other fees and expenses are to be borne by the recipients.

Note

The CWA of 80% must be achieved at the time of application. Please note that only students meeting the criteria are eligible to apply for the scholarship. The scholarship is not guaranteed as all applications go through a selection process.

The application must be submitted with all the required documents as below:



All international students are required to obtain a Student Pass (Visa) for the purpose to study in Malaysia. Students are not permitted to travel to Malaysia prior to the approval. The Immigration Department of Malaysia issues and regulates the passes. Curtin University Malaysia does not have the authority to approve or reject your student pass application.

Before coming to campus

Visa application must be applied directly to Education Malaysia Global Services (EMGS). The application process can take up from six (6) to eight (8) weeks, so you are advised to submit your application as early as possible. To find out more, visit visa.educationmalaysia.gov.my

Documents (softcopy) required

- Letter of Offer
- Passport-size photographs (3.5cm x 4.5cm) white background
- All pages of your passport(s) You must ensure your passport has a validity of eighteen (18) months and more
- · Latest academic transcripts and certificates
- Completed Health Declaration Form
- Completed Pre-Arrival Medical Check-Up in your home country
- Select either one of the Medical Insurances offered by FMGS

Once you received your Electronic Visa Approval
Letter (eVAL), kindly proceed to the Malaysian Embassy
stated in the letter for application of Single-Entry Visa
(SEV) and travel to Malaysia. For more information, visit

Recently, Immigration Department of Malaysia has introduced Electronic Visa (eVISA) for some countries. This means you can apply SEV via online. Please refer to the nearest Malaysian Embassy/High Commissions/Consulate office to get more information. Remember that eVAL and SEV are not the Student Pass (Visa). Coming to Malaysia

Plan your travels to enter Malaysia at least one (1) month before your eVAL expires. Please ensure that you have sufficient funds to cover the cost of living in Malaysia for approximately twelve (12) weeks.

Present all required documents to the Immigration Department Counter at the airport and they will issue you with an entry Special Pass stamp. Note that the Special Pass is only valid between 14 to 30 days.

If you receive a Social Pass stamp, please return to the Immigration Department Counter and request for an amendment of the stamp. The Immigration Department of Malaysia will not issue you with a Student Pass sticker if a Social Pass stamp is issued

Student Pass endorsement process by the Immigration
Department of Malaysia takes between two (2) to four (4) weeks.
Once your passport has been endorsed (with the issuance of a student pass sticker), International Student Office (ISO) will contact you via email for collection.

You are advised not to make any travel plans until your passport has been returned with your student pass endorsement sticker.


Applying online:

If you'd rather not apply through an agent, find your course at **curtin.edu.my/study** and click **APPLY NOW**. From here, you can begin the online application process. Make sure your documents are ready to upload.

Successful applicants will receive an offer package, which explains how to accept Curtin's offer and enrol. Once your enrolment is complete, you'll receive your Confirmation of Enrolment.
